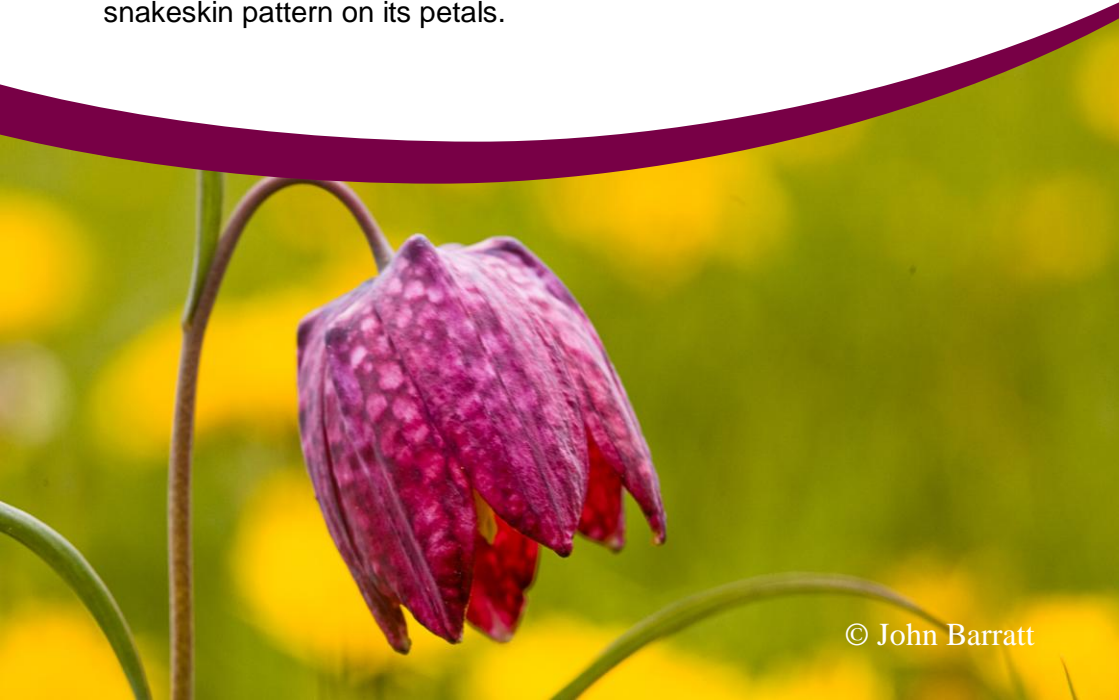

The springtime display of wild snakeshead fritillaries at North Meadow is one of England's wildlife spectacles.

Around eighty per cent of Britain's snake's head fritillaries grow at North Meadow. This is a beautiful and nationally scarce flower, so named after the shape of the flower bud before it opens and the snakeskin pattern on its petals.

As well as the fritillaries North Meadow has a great variety of wildflowers and is of international importance as one of the finest examples of a lowland hay meadow in Europe.

The National Nature Reserve is open to the public at all times, but you can also join a guided tour led by the Reserve Manager.

Join a guided walk to learn about how Natural England and the Cricklade Manorial Court manage the meadow, about how winter floods are important for the flowers, and the fascinating history of this ancient place.
