



Walks Information

There are three waymarked walks around the Reserve which take in the main viewpoints and features of interest.

**Clifftop Stroll – allow 30 minutes
750 metre circular walk**

Difficulty: easy / moderate - unsurfaced path.
Features of interest: ancient sea-cliff, viewpoint, heathland and pine woodland.

**Le Hair's Hike – allow 45 minutes
1250 metres**

Difficulty: moderate - undulating ground with one series of steps.
Unsurfaced path
Features of interest: wet and dry heathland

**Heathland Ramble – allow 1 hour 30 minutes
2 kilometres**

Difficulty: moderate / difficult - rugged terrain, with steep slopes and one section of boardwalk.
Features of interest: bog, wet and dry heathland and pine woodland

Drop off point

The reserve lies between the town of Dersingham and the village of Wolferton, two km west of Sandringham. The A149 forms the site's eastern boundary, and a disused railway line between Dersingham and Wolferton marks the reserve's western boundary.

By car, access is via minor roads from the A149 to Wolferton. There are two car parks offering access to the reserve, one near Wolferton.

The Outreach Adviser will meet you by Scissor car park (drop off point) at the arranged time, where the children can be dropped off. The coach will need to find somewhere to park nearby, as there is no coach parking facility on the reserve.

There is a circular walk connecting both the reserve car parks. There are information panels and signs, available on-site.
